### WEEKLY UPDATE:

- **City Budget Presentations:** City budget presentations continued this week with three presentations by the city manager and a full council workshop regarding the proposed FY 17 budget. The proposed budget is a lean budget which includes no tax or utility rate increase but does include a monthly sanitation rate increase of \$0.50 per month.
- **Exit 54 Interchange Improvements:** City staff reviewed three proposed interchange landscaping improvement plans for I-26 and Exit 54. Portions of all three plans will be included in a new design under development by the contract engineers.
- **Museum Commission Meeting:** The Museum Commission met with representatives from the Spartanburg County Historic Society and the Union County Historic Society this week regarding their plans to dissolve as a commission and reform as a community organization focused on historic preservation in our city.
- **Mosquito Borne Illnesses:** The City Manager attended a meeting this week regarding the threat of mosquito vectored diseases, such as Zika, in Columbia. While the city will be spraying for mosquitos this summer, the best way to control mosquitos is to eliminate the places that they breed. City inspectors will be focused on encouraging people to drain fountains and small pools, empty containers that might hold rainwater, and dispose of tires or other containers that hold water outside.
- **Administrators and Managers Meeting:** The City Manager attended the City Manager's and Administrators meeting in Columbia this week.
- **I26 Commerce Park:** Work began this week on the mass grading of the new pad at the I-26 Commerce Park.
