### WEEKLY UPDATE:

- **National Day of Prayer:** A National Day of Prayer ceremony was held this week in Griffin Park.
- **Grand Opening:** The grand opening and ribbon cutting of Dr. K. Derrick's new dental offices was held this week at the offices on Springdale Drive.
- **PMPA Legislative Breakfast:** Mayor McLean, City Manager Stovall, and DPW&U Director Satterfield represented the City of Clinton at the annual PMPA Legislative Breakfast in Columbia this week.
- **City Council Meeting:** A full city council agenda on Monday night resulted in the approval of the Local Option Sales Tax for FY17, first reading of the budget, a grant to support the CEDC speculative building project, proclamations and recognition of local teams and students, suspension of blue laws for six month, extension of the WMA agreement at Lake Austin, a new general liability insurance contract, establishment of a community grant fund, and awarding of construction bids for Streetscape IV in addition to other items.
- **Copeland Street:** The city has received notice that they have been awarded an RIA grant to begin the repair and replacement of sewer lines on Copeland Street. The grant will also result in the repaving of Copeland Street.
- **I 26 Commerce Park:** Grading of the pad at I-26 Commerce Park is well underway, and bids will be released for grading the site for the speculative building soon. The CEDC has signed a speculative building lease agreement and a grant, from the City Council to the CEDC to support the project, has been issued.
- **Vehicle Abatement Program:** Marketing materials regarding the Vehicle Abatement Program went out this week and will go out with each utility bill all month long. Abandoned and derelict vehicles will be granted amnesty through June 30, after which the city will aggressively enforce ordinances related to abandoned and derelict vehicles.
