WEEKLY UPDATE:

- **Catawba Owners Group:** City staff attended the Catawba Owners Group meeting in Asheville. The meeting offers an opportunity for staff to interact with personnel who operate and maintain the Catawba facility and to review future plans for the facility.
- **Trails Public Meeting:** A public meeting regarding the proposed Lauren County Trails Plan was held Tuesday evening. The event gave citizens the opportunity to review and discuss the proposed county wide trails plan.
- **Town Rhythms:** The last Town Rhythms event for the season brought a large crowd downtown. The event featured the Swingin' Medallions and a block party to welcome PC students back to the city.
- **B&P Shades Fire:** The B&P Shade facility on Carolina Avenue caught fire on Wednesday evening. There was extensive damage to the building, but no injuries were reported.
- **Flight of the Dove:** The annual Flight of the Dove, which brings hundreds of riders to our community as part of a fundraiser for Laurens County Hospice, is scheduled to take place this weekend.
- **Phone System Replacement:** The city phone system is being replaced through a joint project with PMPA over the next two months. The new system will offer additional features that should improve customer service and the city's ability to respond to citizens in a timely manner.
- **Whooping Cough Incident:** SCDHEC made the city aware of a single incident at Clinton Elementary School in which a student was diagnosed with Whooping Cough. The school district sent notification letters home with each student and the city provided links to additional information on the city's website.

- **New Dining Options at Presbyterian College:** Moe's, Boars Head Deli, a Provisions on Demand Store, and a Starbucks Brewer opened on campus at the Springs Student Center at PC this week. The new restaurant facilities and food court are open to the public.
