

MAY 7, 2018

The regular Council meeting was held at the M.S. Bailey Center at 6:00 PM with Mayor Bob McLean presiding with Councilmembers Cook, Jenkins, Kuykendall, Neal, Roth and Young. The City Attorney and the City Manager were present. Local news media present were Larry Franklin from the Clinton Chronicle, Randy Stephens from WLBG, and Judith Brown from the Laurens Advertiser. Notice was mailed and emailed to all local news media on April 23, 2018.

INVOCATION The invocation was given by Reverend Deryk Morgan from the Elizabeth Street Church of God.

PLEDGE ALLEGIANCE Mayor McLean asked Council and the audience to stand and recite the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES Mayor McLean asked Council to approve the minutes from April 2 and 9. Motion was made by Councilmember Cook to approve the April 2, 2018 Council minutes and the April 9, 2018 budget workshop minutes and seconded by Councilmember Neal. The vote was unanimous.

**SCIENCE OLYMPIAD
MIDDLE SCHOOL
CLINTON HIGH** Mayor McLean stated that Clinton Middle School Olympiad Science Team has won the State title sixteen years in a row and the Clinton High Science Olympiad Team has won nine out of the last ten years. Mayor McLean recognized the Clinton Middle School Science Olympiad team and presented them with a plaque in honor of their State Championship title. **RESOLUTION
SCIENCE OLYMPIAD** Mayor McLean stated that Council has before them a Resolution honoring the 2018 SC Science Olympiad Championship teams from the Clinton Middle School and Clinton High School. Motion was made by Councilmember Young to approve the Resolution and seconded by Councilmember Neal. The vote was unanimous.

**CONTRIBUTION
SCIENCE OLYMPIAD** Councilmember Cook stated that the Local Assistance Committee would like to make a recommendation that Council approve a contribution of \$5,000 to School District 56 to use toward travel expenses for the Science Olympiad teams as they compete for the National Championship title. Mayor McLean stated that since this recommendation comes from a committee it does not need a second. The vote was unanimous.

**CITIZEN ADDRESS
COUNCIL
BEPHIE LAGRANDE
EVENT ORDINANCE** Mayor McLean recognized Bephe Legrand from the Municipal Association. Ms. Legrand stated that she was before Council in support of the Special Events Ordinance. Ms. Legrand stated that Cities and Municipalities are adopting Special Events Ordinances for the safety of attendees, vendors, and staff. Ms. Legrand stated that the City should monitor the permit requests. Ms. Legrand stated that the Special Events Ordinance would provide the City with the necessary tools to organize the events. Ms. Legrand stated that by adopting the Ordinance the City would take the steps to host well organized events.

**BUD MARCHANT
EVENT ORDINANCE** Mayor McLean recognized Nancy Katzberg. Ms. Katzberg stated that Mr. Marchant was out of town and she would read his statement to Council. Mr. Marchant stated in his statement that he was a property owner in downtown Clinton and he was in favor of serving alcohol during the downtown events.

Mr. Marchant stated that the Ordinance allows the City to sell alcohol at certain events and these events would be monitored and supervised. Mr. Marchant stated that other Cities in the surrounding area have grown their downtown. Mr. Marchant stated that the Special Events Ordinance gives the City the necessary tools to improve the downtown events. Mr. Marchant stated that not selling alcohol during the downtown events may prevent people from coming to the event. Mr. Marchant stated that growth in the downtown would only happen when the City is open to everyone.

**NANCY KATZBERG
EVENT ORDINANCE**

Mayor McLean recognized Ms. Nancy Katzberg. Ms. Katzberg stated that she is in favor of the Special Events Ordinance. Ms. Katzberg stated that many businesses have opened and closed within a year in Clinton. Ms. Katzberg stated that Clinton needs to attract businesses as well as families to Clinton.

**COSTELL LETTLE JR
MARTHA DENDY**

Mayor McLean recognized Mr. Costell Little Jr. Mr. Little stated that he was before Council regarding the Martha Dendy property. Mr. Little stated that this project has been going on for ten years. Mr. Little stated that the City asked them to withdraw their bid for a Commercial Historic Site in order to receive funding from the City and State. Mr. Little stated that everything has come to a standstill on this project. Mr. Little stated that all of the projects are being done on the east side of Clinton and not the west side of Clinton. Mr. Little asked Council to finish the Martha Dendy project.

**RICKY JOHNSON
MARTHA DENDY**

Mayor McLean recognized Mr. Ricky Johnson. Mr. Johnson stated that he was before Council regarding the Martha Dendy Project. Mr. Johnson stated that the City would like to tear the building beside the gym down because people are going in and vandalizing the building. Mr. Johnson stated that the building has cameras on the building to catch people going into the property. Mr. Johnson stated that the City says the area around the Martha Dendy property is drug infested. Mr. Johnson stated that if the City knows this is a drug infested area then clean up the area. Mr. Johnson stated that Council works for the citizens and the citizens do not work for Council. Mr. Johnson stated that when people come into these meetings Council would listen but not answer. Mr. Johnson stated that the City has a drug problem throughout the City not in just one area of the City. Mr. Johnson stated that he has tried to speak with the Mayor and if the Mayor sees him he goes the opposite way. Mayor McLean stated that he is Mayor to all the citizens in Clinton. Mayor McLean stated that he has never run from Mr. Johnson and his phone number is in the phone book.

**ASHTON BARRINGTON
EVENT ORDINANCE**

Mayor McLean recognized Mr. Ashton Barrington. Mr. Barrington stated that he was before Council concerning the Special Events Ordinance. Mr. Barrington stated that he owned Jitters Cafe, a business downtown. Mr. Barrington stated that the reason given to sell alcohol is that everyone is doing it. Mr. Barrington stated that he wanted to know what this would cost the City. Mr. Barrington asked what is it going to cost the City when a citizen has one or two beers and has a wreck. Mr. Barrington stated that downtown merchants already sell alcohol. Mr. Barrington stated that the past downtown events did not serve alcohol and the events were packed with people. Mr. Barrington stated that the City would have to increase security which is an extra expense. Mr. Barrington stated that there may be other ways to bring people downtown.

**BETTY WALLENZINE
EVENT ORDINANCE**

Mayor McLean recognized Ms. Betty Wallenzine. Ms. Wallenzine stated that she lives at 108 Oakland Street and she is before Council concerning the Special Events Ordinance. Ms. Wallenzine stated that she understands the people who drink downtown will stay in a specific location. Ms. Wallenzine asked if they have to stay there until the festival is over. Ms. Wallenzine stated that she was employed with the City of Clinton for 25 years as a Dispatcher and she has handled many drunks. Ms. Wallenzine stated that a person's personality changes whenever they drink. Ms. Wallenzine stated that she was against letting people drink downtown.

**CHARLOTTE STRICKLAND
EVENT ORDINANCE**

Mayor McLean recognized Ms. Charlotte Strickland. Ms. Strickland stated that she lives at 100 Calvert Avenue and she supports the Special Events Ordinance. Ms. Strickland stated that she understands many people are opposed to the Ordinance. Ms. Strickland stated that the City of Laurens serves alcohol at their events and just recently hosted a Sip and Stroll Event in downtown Laurens. Ms. Strickland stated that some people are trying to turn this into a moral or religious issue but an individual choosing to take a social drink is a matter of preference. Ms. Strickland stated that many churches serve wine during their communion and even Disney World serves alcohol. Ms. Strickland stated that more people from the surrounding areas would come to the City's events if alcohol is served. Ms. Strickland stated that the City needs to attract young people and serving alcohol at these events would help. Ms. Strickland stated that the City spent money to be a part of the Main Street Program and the Main Street Program recommended this Ordinance.

**KENNY MOORE
EVENT ORDINANCE**

Mayor McLean recognized Reverend Kenny Moore. Reverend Moore stated that he lives at 205 Copeland Street and he is opposed to serving alcohol. Reverend Moore stated that he is not against the Special Events Ordinance but he is concerned about the sale of alcohol. Reverend Moore stated that since the sale of alcohol is a small piece of the Ordinance he requests Council omit the section concerning the sale of alcohol. Reverend Moore stated that he has worked with the effects of alcohol for many years and has learned that nothing good comes from alcohol. Reverend Moore stated that in 2016 there were 316 alcohol related deaths in South Carolina. Reverend Moore asked Council not to contribute to this statistic.

**DARLENE SUMMER
EVENT ORDINANCE**

Mayor McLean recognized Ms. Darlene Summer. Ms. Summer stated that she was a property owner in Clinton and she supported the Special Events Ordinance. Ms. Summer stated that she receives phone calls from potential renters wanting to know what Clinton has to offer. Ms. Summer stated that Clinton needs to catch up with the surrounding Cities. Ms. Summer stated that alcohol is already present at the downtown events. Ms. Summer stated that she has witnessed people putting the alcohol in their cups during the event. Ms. Summer stated that the Special Events Ordinance allows the City to control the environment and also make money. Ms. Summer stated that the citizens in Clinton know how to act and if beer is being sold for \$5.00 a cup then not too many people are going to buy a lot of alcohol. Ms. Summer stated that the City needs to move forward. Ms. Summer stated that the City has enough sense not to serve alcohol at the children's events.

**SKIPPER SMITH
EVENT ORDINANCE**

Mayor McLean recognized Mr. Skipper Smith. Mr. Smith stated that he supported the Special Events Ordinance. Mr. Smith stated that he supports the revitalization of Clinton and the Special Events Ordinance would help. Mr. Smith stated that he has read the Ordinance and the controls would be in place to handle any problems concerning the alcohol.

**DAREN BRIDGEMAN
EVENT ORDINANCE**

Mayor McLean recognized Mr. Daren Bridgeman. Mr. Bridgeman stated that he is before Council in support of the Special Events Ordinance. Mr. Bridgeman stated that he read the Ordinance and thinks it is well written. Mr. Bridgeman stated that the sale of alcohol would be regulated and controlled. Mr. Bridgeman stated that the surrounding Cities are selling alcohol at their events and Clinton needs to move forward and do the same. Mr. Bridgeman stated that he has confidence in the City staff not to sale alcohol during the children's events.

**HARRY AGNEW
EVENT ORDINANCE**

Mayor McLean recognized Mr. Jeff Smith. Mr. Smith stated that he was here on behalf of Mr. Harry Agnew. Mr. Smith stated that he would read a prepared statement from Mr. Agnew. Mr. Agnew thanked the Council and City staff for making Clinton a prosperous City. Mr. Agnew thanked the City for becoming involved in the Main Street Program. Mr. Agnew stated that the Special Events Ordinance is a necessary step the City should take in order to compete with the surrounding Cities. Mr. Agnew stated that the Special Events Ordinance would regulate the sale of alcohol during these events.

**SARAH HILL
EVENT ORDINANCE**

Mayor McLean recognized Ms. Sarah Hill. Ms. Hill stated that she is proud of the residents that came to the meeting tonight whether they are for or against the Ordinance. Ms. Hill stated that she supports the Special Events Ordinance and the Ordinance would allow the City to compete on a level playing field with other Cities. Ms. Hill stated that the restricted area serving the alcohol would be separated from children and the vendors would be licensed to sale alcohol. Ms. Hill stated that Clinton needs to move forward and try to attract young professionals to Clinton.

**MEGAN WALSH
EVENT ORDINANCE**

Mayor McLean recognized Ms. Megan Walsh. Ms. Walsh stated that she lives at 300 Cedar Street and she supports the Special Events Ordinance. Ms. Walsh stated that she wanted to acknowledge the pain many families suffer from substance abuse. Ms. Walsh stated that the prevailing theme of those opposed to this Ordinance is fear and an acronym for fear is false evidence appearing real. Ms. Walsh stated that she supports the Special Events Ordinance and currently the downtown restaurants serve alcohol without incident.

**ROBERT SAPP
EVENT ORDINANCE**

Mayor McLean recognized Mr. Robert Sapp. Mr. Sapp stated that he lives at 110 Oakland Street and he is opposed to the Special Events Ordinance. Mr. Sapp stated that he considers Clinton a family orientated City and does not understand why Council would consider an Ordinance allowing selling alcohol. Mr. Sapp stated that he is a former Police Officer and worked in Clemson. Mr. Sapp stated that even though people could not drink in the football stadium there would be issues because the fans would consume alcohol before entering the stadium. Mr. Sapp stated that the City could still have events without the sale of alcohol and the local restaurants would still be able to sale alcohol. Mr. Sapp asked Council to vote no and keep Clinton a family orientated City.

**ADAM POWERS
EVENT ORDINANCE**

Mayor McLean recognized Reverend Adam Powers. Reverend Powers stated that the common theme tonight is everyone wants what is best for Clinton and there are differences of opinions here tonight. Reverend Powers stated that the Cracker Barrel and Chic-Fil-A are businesses that built their businesses on a moral standard and both of these businesses prosper. Reverend Powers asked if the citizens in Clinton could vote on the Special Events Ordinance instead of letting Council make the decision.

**CHRIS SULLIVAN
EVENT ORDINANCE**

Mayor McLean recognized Reverend Chris Sullivan. Reverend Sullivan stated that he is the Reverend at the Community Baptist at 704 North Adair Street. Reverend Sullivan stated that he opposes the sale of alcohol and there is nothing he can add to the argument that would change Council's mind. Reverend Sullivan stated that Community Baptist would support Clinton regardless of the decision made here tonight.

**JOHN CHAPMAN
EVENT ORDINANCE**

Mayor McLean recognized Mr. John Chapman. Mr. Chapman stated that he is in favor of the Special Events Ordinance. Mr. Chapman stated that Ordinance regulates the events and the Ordinance is well put together. Mr. Chapman stated that the Special Events Ordinance would allow Clinton to grow as well as compete with other Cities.

**SUSAN GALLOWAY
EVENT ORDINANCE**

Mayor McLean recognized Ms. Susan Galloway. Ms. Galloway stated that she lives at 106 East Maple Street and she supports the Special Events Ordinance. Ms. Galloway stated that she has been to several events in other Cities that serve alcohol and has yet to see any public disorderly conduct and she does not see why Clinton should be any different. Mayor McLean thanked everyone for coming and speaking to Council. Mayor McLean stated that there may be a lot of division tonight but one thing he has learned is not everyone wins. Mayor McLean stated that not everyone wins an event but at the end of the event everyone lines up and shakes hands. Mayor McLean stated that he hopes no one makes enemies based on the way someone voted tonight. Mayor McLean stated everyone wants the same thing and that is for Clinton to move forward and be the best town it can be. Mayor McLean stated that is why he is Mayor because he does not need this job but I live here and I raised my family here. Mayor McLean stated that if Clinton does well then everyone does well. Mayor McLean stated that no one would find alcohol in his house but that does not mean he would enforce his opinions on someone else.

Mr. Cannon stated that the next item on the agenda is the approval of Proclamations proclaiming May as ALS Awareness Month, May as Historic Preservation Month, May as Mental Health Awareness Month, May as National Military Appreciation Month, May 15, 2018 as Peace Officer's Memorial Day, May 6-12 as Drinking Water Week, Municipal Clerks Week, and Public Service Recognition Week, May 7-11 as Teacher Appreciation Week, and May 20-26 as National Public Works Week. Motion was made by Councilmember Young to approve the Proclamations and seconded by Councilmember Jenkins. The vote was unanimous. Councilmember Kuykendall encouraged everyone to let teachers know how much you appreciate them and their job. Mayor McLean stated that he wanted to recognize Council since May 20-26 is Public Works Week. Mayor McLean stated this is a tough job for very little money. Mayor McLean stated that this Council is one of the most qualified Council in the State for the lowest pay. Mayor McLean recognized Councilmembers Young and Roth during National Military Appreciation Month and thank them for their military service.

Mayor McLean recognized Mr. Jonathon Sampson from Thornwell. Mr. Sampson stated that for 143 years Thornwell has helped children in Laurens County. Mr. Sampson stated that one way Thornwell helps children is placing children in foster homes. Mr. Sampson stated that there are 126 children in foster care in Laurens County and there are only 35 licensed foster homes. Mr. Sampson stated that a Community who cares for their foster children does care about the Community's future because those foster children grow up and become members of the Community. Mr. Sampson thanked Council for recognizing foster care.

Mayor McLean stated that the next item on the agenda is the approval of a Proclamation proclaiming May as Foster Care Month. Motion was made by Councilmember Kuykendall to approve the Proclamation and seconded by Councilmember Neal. The vote was unanimous. Councilmember Young presented Mr. Sampson with a plaque in honor of Foster Care Month.

Mayor McLean stated that the City would purchase the cabinets from New England lab for \$45,771.69. Councilmember Cook made a motion to approve the purchase of cabinets for the Filter Plant for a cost not to exceed \$45,771.69 and seconded by Councilmember Young. The vote was unanimous.

Mayor McLean stated that the next item on the agenda is the approval of the first reading of an Ordinance to temporarily suspend the application of Sunday sales prohibitions within the corporate limits of the City of Clinton. Motion was made by Councilmember Kuykendall to approve the first reading of an Ordinance to suspend the Blue Laws and seconded by Councilmember Young. The vote was unanimous.

**SECOND READING

SPECIAL EVENTS**

Mayor McLean stated that the next item on the agenda is the approval of the second reading of an Ordinance to approve the Special Events Ordinance. Councilmember Cook stated that he appreciated the sincerity and thoughtfulness from the public in regards to this Ordinance. Councilmember Cook stated that it has not been an easy decision for him as well as other Councilmembers. Councilmember Cook stated that this Community needs to support each other regardless of the outcome of this vote. Councilmember Cook stated that if issues come from the Special Events Ordinance then Council would try to address them. Councilmember Cook stated that citizens should not leave this meeting with any kind of name calling because that belittles Clinton. Councilmember Cook stated that regardless of his personal convictions he must vote for what is right for Clinton. Councilmember Cook stated that citizens need to support the decision fully and Council could look at the statistics from the decision tonight and see if it is working. Councilmember Cook stated that this Ordinance has not been taken lightly by anyone on this Council. Councilmember Kuykendall stated that Clinton has always been a conservative town and it is a tough move to go in another direction. Councilmember Kuykendall stated that some people have stated that if alcohol is served then they would not come.

Councilmember Kuykendall stated that no matter a person's religious beliefs what makes the events special is the spirit of God. Councilmember Kuykendall asked all of the Ministers in attendance tonight to be part of the City's events because that is the mission field. Kuykendall stated that God has blessed Clinton through the years and he prays that God would continue to bless Clinton. Motion was made by Councilmember Roth to approve the second reading of an Ordinance for Special Events and seconded by Councilmember Neal. The vote was unanimous. Reverend Moore asked to address Council and was given permission to do so. Reverend Moore stated that he has never said that he would not attend any City events. Reverend Moore stated that Council would be in his prayers. Reverend Moore stated that he is disappointed by the decision but if needed Council could call on him. Reverend Moore stated that he does not support the sale of alcohol but he does support Clinton.

Motion was made by Councilmember Cook to authorize the City Manager to enter into an agreement with Laurens County Water Sewer Commission (LCWSC) for a Customer Comprehensive Study for a cost not to exceed \$35,000 to determine the feasibility of the City purchasing water from LCWSC at a wholesale rate and seconded by Councilmember Roth. Mayor Mclean thanked Public Works for cutting the grass between TD Bank and Arthur State Bank. Mayor McLean stated the area looks good.
